This table has really helped me “see the big picture” regarding what the New Testament teaches about the Holy Spirit, especially regarding the miraculous power of the Spirit that the early church received. I think we all need to be careful not to directly apply passages to people today which only had a direct application to the early church in the miraculous age. That is one of the main purposes behind this table—to show how the New Testament often uses certain terms and phrases regarding miraculous power. Seeing how such terms are used throughout the New Testament can shed light on passages which use this kind of terminology, when the said passage’s immediate context may not reveal the meaning as clearly as other similar passages.

Hopefully this table will also be helpful to anyone studying the gift and promise of Acts 2:38-39 (see article on “The Gift and Promise of Acts 2:38-39” on <http://www.TheBibleDomain.com>), because many of the same terms (e.g., gift, received, promise) are used throughout the New Testament in reference to the miraculous power that was available to the early church.

I am not claiming that this table is fully comprehensive, and if someone finds a verse I missed that would be applicable, please let me know so I can add it. There are other columns I would add if I had more room, such as “Sealed,” “Earnest,” and “Anointing,” which are often used in miraculous contexts, but I am limited in what I can fit onto one page. Perhaps I will add those columns in a later revision, so check back later if you like.
